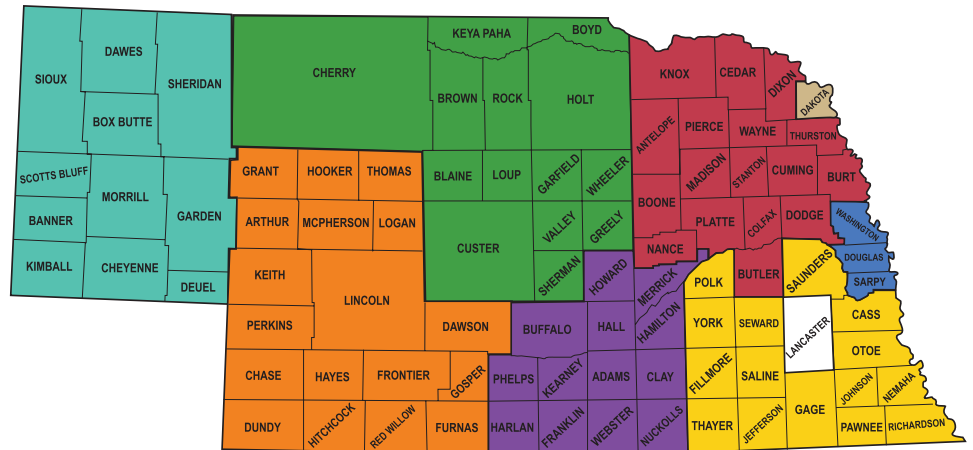

Nebraska Economic Development Districts

Background –

Neb. Rev. Stat. 13-1901 through 13-1907 defines Development Districts and describes how Development Districts are formed pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Act and defining that local government shall mean a county, city, or village. Development Districts shall be governed by a policy board (a volunteer board of directors, composed of elected officials and business/community leaders from within the district’s boundaries) and shall, as directed by its policy board, serve as a regional resource center and provide planning, community and economic development, and technical assistance to local governments which are members of the district and may provide assistance to industrial development organizations, tourism promotion organizations, community development groups, and similar organizations upon request. Specifically, Neb. Rev. Stat. 13-1905 through 13-1907 allows direct funding to be provided to Development Districts from the State but this has not occurred in decades.

Development Districts provide statewide coverage, except Lancaster County, for state and federal programs and include all the defined local governments. Professional Staff are regularly attending county, city, and village board meetings to gain firsthand knowledge of community needs as well as a program’s effectiveness. They work with numerous state and federal agencies, writing and administering program grants.


The Economic Development Administration (EDA) federally recognizes all of the participating Development Districts. The Nebraska Regional Officials Council (NROC) is an Association of the Nebraska Economic Development Districts. Development Districts know their region and the communities they serve and collaborate as a statewide organization to provide a sounding board to deliver the maximum benefit of services that can be provided with the funds that are available.

Funding –

In an effort to work with the Nebraska Department of Economic Development (DED) to provide those services, in exchange for funding that is allowed under current state law, we provide the following list (see reverse side) as potential areas that can be included or expanded to meet the needs of the state and the communities we serve.

We will follow the statute as directed under 13-1907 in the implementation, reporting and accountability of the activities. Funding criteria is based on an existing formula and the amount funded to each district would be different. Each Development District would provide services in proportion to the amount received and/or as specific programs germane to their particular district would require.

The Development Districts provide statewide coverage of DED programs and other federal programs. They are staffed with certified professionals that have experience in implementing programs and projects and are the frontline personnel in the communities they serve.
